Encl: (1) Functions of EDOSCOL

1. Purpose. To publish functions of EDOSCOL under the mission established by references (a) and (b).
2. Cancellation. CNTECHTRAINST 5450.71E
3. Mission. To improve the professional proficiency of Engineering Duty Officers through training in those plans, programs, policies and procedures by which the Navy accomplishes the life cycle engineering of Naval ships and systems. To foster and serve as a focal point of Engineering Duty Officer community development.
4. Status and Command Relationships. EDOSCOL is a shore activity in an active, fully operational status.
  - a. Echelon
    - (1) Chief of Naval Operations
    - (2) Chief of Naval Education and Training (CNET)
    - (3) EDOSCOL
  - b. Area Coordination
    - (1) Area Coordinator - Commander in Chief, U.S. Pacific Fleet
    - (2) Regional Area Coordinator - Commander, Naval Base, San Diego
5. Overseas Diplomacy. EDOSCOL serves as an effective instrument of the U.S. foreign policy by initiating and conducting action programs which promote positive relations between the command and foreign nationals, and which assist individual naval personnel and their families to work

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effectively, live with dignity and satisfaction, and function as positive representatives of the Navy and of the United States while overseas.

6. Action. In accomplishing the assigned mission, EDOSCOL will ensure performance of the functions in enclosure (1) and advise CNET of any recommended modification to the mission or functions of EDOSCOL.

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## FUNCTIONS OF EDOSCOL

1. Carry out all regulations, instructions, and directives from higher authority pertaining to the administration of EDOSCOL; issue such detailed internal instructions, regulations, orders, and notices as are required for the efficient organization and administration of the command.
2. Ensure that training courses developed or revised by the command are in consonance with the instructional systems development procedures established by higher authority; ensure that the training of all personnel enrolled in the schools and courses established by CNET, at this command, are conducted in accordance with directives and procedures established by higher authority. Perform course curricula model manager functions for courses under curricula model management of EDOSCOL.
3. In support of Navy policy emphasizing the importance of military and motivational training and in recognition of the effect such training has on retention, upgrading professionalism, and improving the perception of the Navy, ensure that the military and motivational aspects of training are given strong emphasis equal to the emphasis afforded the technical areas.
4. Ensure successful and uniform accomplishment of training in accordance with prescribed course material on a standardized basis and ensure high standards of qualification in instructors and students. In furtherance of these objectives, carry out on a continuing basis an evaluation of instruction and the complete learning environment. Requests for waivers in instructional standards and testing procedures should be submitted to CNET.
5. Make recommendations to CNET and COMNAVSEASYSKOM regarding the design and development of new course material and any necessary changes to established course curricula.
6. Maintain close liaison with the local area coordinator, or such other commander as may be designated in writing, for emergency and disaster preparedness.
7. Exercise control over numerous management programs and functional areas inherent of a naval shore activity which should include but not limited to, retention, occupational safety and health, traffic and recreational safety, internal review, equal employment opportunity, command managed equal opportunity, and other similar management programs.

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8. Administer the Engineering Duty Qualification Program for, and provide direct support to, the Engineering Duty community sponsor (COMNAVSEASYSKOM).
9. Provide existing courses, or specially tailored adaptations thereof, as directed by CNET, to meet the training requirements of the Navy and, to the degree necessary, the Marine Corps, Army, Air Force, Coast Guard, foreign nationals under the Military Assistance Program or Foreign Military Sales, and civilian personnel attached to Navy industrial activities.
10. Exercise effective control over the financial operations within the command through sound accounting principles and progressive modernization of programming, budgeting, accounting, and statistical reporting and auditing practices under the Resources Management System of the Department of the Navy.
11. Keep CNET advised regarding the general progress and results of training being conducted in the command.
12. Perform such other functions as may be directed by CNET.
