ATLANTIC (FCTCLANT), VIRGINIA BEACH, VA

Encl: (1) Functions of FCTCLANT

1. Purpose. To publish functions of FCTCLANT under the mission established by reference (a).

2. Mission. To provide quality education and training to Sailors in specified combat systems operation and maintenance, to provide specialized skills training to individuals, to provide training systems support to operational and systems commands, and to perform other such functions and tasks as may be directed by higher authority.

3. Status and Command Relationships. FCTCLANT is a shore activity in an active, fully operational status under a Commanding Officer.

a. Echelon

(1) Chief of Naval Operations

(2) Chief of Naval Education and Training (CNET)

(3) FCTCLANT

b. Area Coordination

(1) Area Coordinator - Commander in Chief, U.S. Atlantic Fleet

(2) Regional Area Coordinator - Commander, Navy Region Mid-Atlantic, Norfolk

4. Overseas Diplomacy. FCTCLANT serves as an effective instrument of U.S. foreign policy by initiating and conducting action programs which promote positive relations between the command and

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action programs which promote positive relations between the command and foreign nationals, and which assist individual naval personnel and their families to work effectively, live with dignity and satisfaction, and function as positive representatives of the Navy and of the United States while overseas.

5. Action. In accomplishing the assigned mission, the Commanding Officer, FCTCLANT will ensure performance of the functions in enclosure (1) and advise CNET of any recommended modification to the assigned mission or functions.

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FUNCTIONS OF FCTCLANT

1. Carry out all regulations, instructions, and directives from higher authority pertaining to the administration of FCTCLANT and issue such detailed internal instructions, regulations, orders, and notices as are required for the efficient organization and administration of the command in support of the mission assigned.
2. Provide technical and professional development training in the operational and functional areas of air intercept control and anti-submarine air control, qualification and designation of Air Intercept Controllers (AIC), anti-submarine air controllers, and control supervisors within the Atlantic Fleet for both tactical data systems and nontactical data systems-equipped ships and aircraft. Provide this training to the Marine Corps, U.S. Army, U.S. Air Force, U.S. Coast Guard, international students under the Military Assistance Program and Foreign Military Sales, and selected civilian personnel of the Department of Defense (DOD) and non-DOD activities.
3. Ensure that the training of all personnel enrolled in the schools and courses established by CNET is in consonance with the Instructional Systems Development as explained in publications from higher authority.
4. Ensure successful and uniform accomplishment of training in accordance with prescribed course material on a standardized basis and ensure high standards of qualification in the individual instructor and student. In support of these objectives, carry out on a continuing basis an evaluation of instruction and the complete learning situation; ensure that applicable portions of Personnel Qualification Standards are accomplished in the course of instruction.
5. Provide technical advice and recommendations to CNET in matters concerning training under command cognizance and effect liaison in direct support of specific projects directed by CNET.
6. In support of Navy policy emphasizing the importance of military and motivational training and in recognition of the effect such training has on retention, upgrading professionalism, and improving the perception of the Navy, ensure that the military and motivational aspects of training are given strong emphasis equal to that afforded the technical areas.

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7. Coordinate and effect actions necessary for the development of training center plant facilities required to support the assigned mission.
8. Provide services and materials to support training programs.
9. Exercise effective control over the financial operations within the command through sound accounting principles and progressive modernization of programming, budgeting, accounting, and statistical reporting and auditing practices under the Resources Management System of the Department of the Navy.
10. Exercise control over numerous management programs and functional areas inherent of a naval shore activity such as retention, occupational safety and health, internal review, equal employment opportunity, command managed equal opportunity, manpower, and security.
11. Maintain close liaison with the Regional Planning Agent or such other commander as may be designated in writing for emergency and disaster preparedness matters.
12. Keep CNET advised regarding the general progress and results of training being conducted in the command.
13. Perform such other functions as may be directed by CNET.
